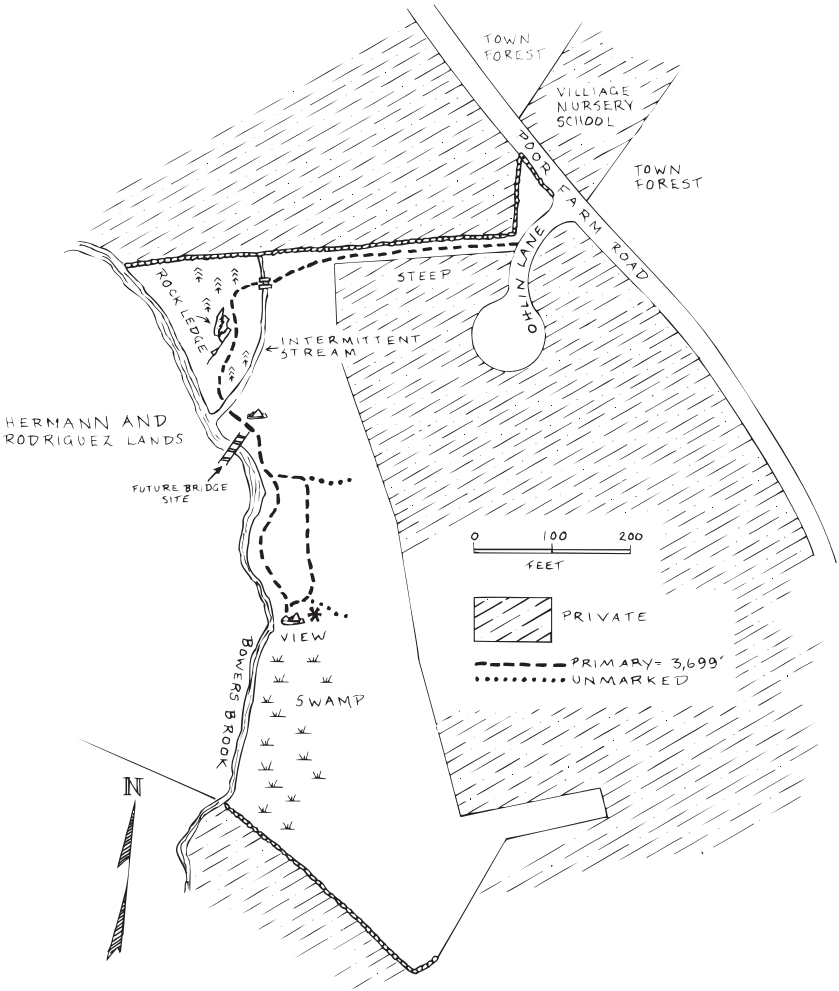


# OHLIN LAND



Hans and Natalie Ohlin donated this land to the Harvard Conservation Trust in 1993. The Trust worked with the Ohlins over the years to develop a plan that would preserve this scenic section of Bowers Brook known as “the narrows”. The 25.5 acre Ohlin land provides a vital connection between the Town Forest, Kaufmann and Holy Hill lands to the east and north and the Rodriquez/Hermann Orchard land to the south and west.

The trail starts off Ohlin Lane, a private way, and descends steeply to cross an intermittent stream, passing by rock ledges covered with rock tripe, a lichen, and through hemlocks and witch hazel on the way to Bowers Brook. The trail parallels Bowers Brook where there are large boulders and views across the brook and wetlands. The Trust is currently investigating the feasibility of constructing a bridge to connect with the Rodriquez and Hermann lands.
