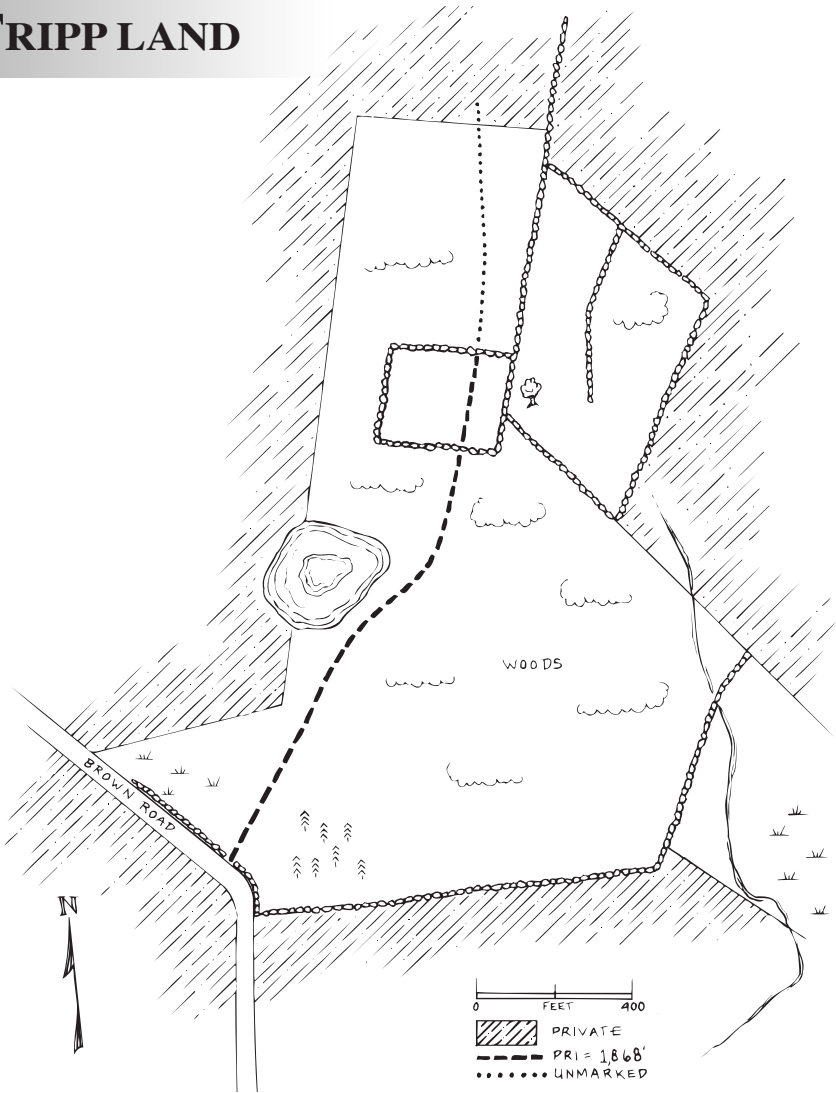


TRIPP LAND



The 42-acre Tripp land was purchased in 2000. Joe Tripp purchased this land in the early 1960's because of its natural beauty. He and his family worked with the Harvard Conservation Trust to ensure that after his death this land would be preserved as open space for future generations to wander, contemplate and enjoy. This purchase is a good example of the Trust and Conservation Commission preservation partnership.

The trail starts at an opening in the stone wall bordering Brown Road, continues through a white pine woods and by a small pond. From here the trail rises gently through oak uplands and passes through several stone walls. There is a large oak visible from the trail at the edge of a stone wall. It is probably a wolf or pasture tree, a large wide-spreading tree that grew up when the land was open pasture land.
